Hon'ble President Smt. Droupadi Murmu Addresses the Nation on the eve of 75th Republic Day



My Dear Fellow Citizens,

Namaskar!

My heartiest greetings to all of you on the eve of the 75th Republic Day! My heart is filled with pride when I look back and see how far we have travelled despite adversities. The 75th year of the Republic is truly a historic milestone in the journey of the nation in many ways. This is an especially festive occasion, just as we celebrated the unique greatness and diverse culture of our nation during the Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav, when we completed 75 years of Independence.

The nation is in the early years of Amrit Kaal, the period leading to the centenary of Independence. This is the time of an epochal transformation. We are given a golden opportunity to take the country to new heights. Contribution from every citizen will be crucial to achieve our goals. For this, I will appeal to all my fellow citizens to abide by our Fundamental Duties enshrined in the Constitution. These duties are essential obligations of every citizen towards making Bharat a developed nation when it completes 100 years of independence. Here, I think of Mahatma Gandhi who had rightly said, "No people have risen who thought only of rights. Only those did so who thought of duties."

Our National festivals are momentous occasions when we together look back and look ahead. If we look at the year since the last Republic Day, there is much to be pleased about. The successful organising of the Group of 20 Summit in the capital, under India's presidency, was an unprecedented achievement. What was all the more noteworthy was the way the people were involved in the G20 events. The ideas and inputs travelled not downwards from the top but upwards from the bottom. The magnificent event provided lessons for all in making citizens participants in strategic and diplomatic matters that are, in the final analysis, going to shape their own future. The G20 Summit also boosted India's emergence as the voice of the Global South, adding a necessary element to the international discourse.

It means: "Not at any time are enmities appeased here through enmity but they are appeased through non-enmity. This is the eternal law."

India's ancient wisdom can also help the world find a way out of the global environmental crisis. I am glad to see India at the forefront of promoting renewable sources of energy and taking a leadership position in global climate action. India has launched the 'LiFE Movement' for adoption of environment-conscious lifestyle. The global community has appreciated our country's emphasis on individual behaviour-change for dealing with the issues of climate change. People everywhere can and must contribute by bringing their lifestyle in tune with Mother Nature. That will not only help save the planet for the generations to come but will also enhance the quality of life.

The period of Amrit Kaal is also going to be the period of unprecedented technological changes. Technological advances like Artificial Intelligence and machine learning have moved from headlines into our daily lives at a breathtaking speed. There are numerous areas of concern in the foreseeable future, but there are also exciting opportunities ahead, especially for the youth. They are exploring new frontiers. We need to do all we can to remove hurdles from their path and let them unleash their full potential. What they want is equality of opportunity. What they want is not the same old rhetoric of equality, but the realisation of our cherished ideal of equality.

It is, after all, their confidence that is building the India of tomorrow. Moreover, the mind of the youth is shaped by teachers, who are the real architects of the nation's future. I would also like to make a thankful mention of our farmers and labourers who toil silently and make a mighty contribution to creating a better future for the nation. On the eve of this auspicious occasion, India also gratefully salutes the members of our Armed Forces, Police and Para-military Forces, without whose valour and vigil we would not have scaled the great heights we have.



Hon'ble Prime Minister Mr. Narendra Modi Inaugurates 10th Edition of Vibrant Gujarat Global Summit




Hon'ble Prime Minister Mr. Narendra Modi inaugurated the 10th edition of Vibrant Gujarat Global Summit 2024 at Mahatma Mandir, Gandhinagar on 10th January 2024. The theme of this year's summit is 'Gateway to the Future' and included the participation of 34 partner countries and 16 partner organizations. Addressing the gathering, the Prime Minister started by conveying his greeting for 2024. He reiterated the pledge to make India 'viksit' by 2047, making the next 25 years 'Amrit Kaal' of the country. "It is time for new dreams, new resolutions and continuous accomplishments", he said. He noted the significance of the first Vibrant Gujarat Summit of the 'Amrit Kaal'.

India is moving forward in the role of a 'Vishwa Mitra' in a fast-changing world. Today India has given the world confidence in achieving common collective goals. India's commitment, efforts and hard work for global welfare is making the world safer and prosperous. The World looks at India as an important pillar of stability. A friend who can be trusted, a partner who believes in people-centric development, a voice that believes in global good, an engine of growth in the global economy, a technology hub for finding solutions, a powerhouse of talented youth and a democracy that delivers ", said the Prime Minister.

"The priorities and aspirations of India's 1.4 billion citizens and their belief in human-centric development coupled with the government's commitment to inclusivity and equality is a major aspect of world prosperity and development", the Prime Minister remarked. Today, the Prime Minister mentioned that India is the 5th largest economy in the world while it lagged at 11th position 10 years ago. He also underlined that in the next few years, India will go on to become one of the top 3 economies in the world, as predicted by various rating agencies in the world. "Experts can analyze this, but I guarantee that India will become the 3rd largest economy in the world", Prime Minister emphasized. He further added that India has become a ray of hope for the world at a time when the world has witnessed multiple geopolitical instabilities. Reflecting on India's priorities whose glimpse can be seen in the Vibrant Gujarat Global Summit, the Prime Minister mentioned sustainable industries, manufacturing and infrastructure, new age skills, futuristic technologies, AI and innovation, green hydrogen, renewable energy, and semiconductors. Prime Minister urged everyone to visit the trade show in Gujarat, especially the school and college students. Speaking about spending time in this trade show with His Excellency Nyusi and His Excellency Ramos Horta, the Prime Minister said that the trade show has showcased products made with world-class state-of-the-art technology in sectors like E-Mobility, Start-Ups, Blue Economy, Green Energy and Smart Infrastructure. He said that new opportunities are constantly being created for investment in all these sectors.

Hon'ble Prime Minister Mr. Narendra Modi inaugurated Atal Bihari Vajpayee Sewri-Nhava Sheva **Atal Setu** in Navi Mumbai on 12th January 2024. Atal Setu has been constructed at the cost of more than Rs 17,840 crores and is about a 21.8 km long 6-lane bridge having about 16.5 km length over the sea and about 5.5 km on the land. It is the longest bridge in India and also the longest sea bridge in India. It will provide faster connectivity to Mumbai International Airport and Navi Mumbai International Airport and will also reduce the travel time from Mumbai to Pune, Goa and South India. It will also improve connectivity between Mumbai Port & Jawaharlal Nehru Port.

Hon'ble Prime Minister Mr. Narendra Modi Addresses NCC Cadets and NSS Volunteers



Hon'ble Prime Minister Mr. Narendra Modi addressed the NCC Cadets and NSS Volunteers on 24th January 2024. Prime Minister reiterated that 'Nation First' should be the guiding principle of the Amrit Generation. The Prime Minister also told the young audience never to allow despair to set in their lives. Stressing the importance of every small contribution, Prime Minister, stressed "Yahi Samay hai Sahi Samay hai, Ye Aapka Samay Hai - This is the right time, this is your time." Stressing the importance of the present moment, the Prime Minister asked the youth to impart strength to their resolve to achieve the goal of Viksit Bharat and to expand the horizon of knowledge so that Indian geniuses could give new direction to the world and gain new capabilities so that India could solve the world's problems. He elaborated on the steps for creating new avenues for youth to

realize their full potential and mentioned creating new opportunities in newly opened sectors. Shri Modi gave examples of creating new opportunities in the space sector, push towards Ease of Doing Business, creating a private sector in the defence industry, establishing the National Research Foundation and creating modern educational facilities to cater to the 21st century. The Prime Minister also mentioned reforming the education system in India which allows attaining higher education in the mother tongue and not being bound to a particular stream or subject. Encouraging the youth to engage in research and innovation, the Prime Minister mentioned Atal Tinkering Labs which inspire creativity and innovation. He underlined that the government has created new opportunities for girl students who want to make a career by joining the army. "Now, girl students can also be admitted to various Sainik schools", the Prime Minister said urging them to move forward with full confidence. "Your efforts, your vision, your potential will take India to new heights, he added.

Hon'ble Prime Minister Mr. Narendra Modi Addresses All India Presiding Officers' Conference



Hon'ble Prime Minister Mr. Narendra Modi addressed the All India Presiding Officers' Conference on 27th January 2024. Reflecting on the importance of learning from the Constituent Assembly, Prime Minister stated, "There is much to learn from our Constituent Assembly. Constituent Assembly members had the responsibility to form a consensus among various thoughts, subjects, and opinions, and they lived up to it." Highlighting the role of the attending Presiding Officers, Prime Minister urged them to draw inspiration from the ideals of the Constituent Assembly once again. "In your respective tenures, strive to leave a legacy that can serve as a heritage for future generations", he emphasized.

Speaking on the need to enhance the functionality of legislative bodies, Prime Minister stated, "Enhancing the efficiency of legislative assemblies and committees is crucial in today's scenario where vigilant citizens scrutinize every representative." Addressing the issue of maintaining decorum within legislative bodies, Prime Minister remarked, "The conduct of members in the house and the conducive environment therein directly impact the productivity of the assembly. Concrete suggestions emanating from this conference will be instrumental in enhancing productivity." He added that conduct in the House by the representatives decides the image of the House. He lamented the fact that parties instead of curtailing the objectionable behaviour of their members come out in their support. "This is not a good situation for either the Parliament or the Assemblies", Prime Minister said.

Reflecting on evolving norms in public life, Prime Minister emphasized the need for accountability. "In the past, allegations of corruption against a member of the house would lead to their ostracization from public life. However, we now witness public glorification of convicted corrupt individuals, which is detrimental to the integrity of the executive, the judiciary and the constitution," he remarked. Prime Minister stressed the importance of discussing and providing concrete suggestions on this matter during the conference.

Referring to Nari Shakti Vandan Adhiniyam, Prime Minister encouraged discussions on suggestions aimed at enhancing women's participation and representation. "Efforts to empower women and increase their representation must be amplified in committees in a country like India," he stated. Similarly, he stressed the need to increase the participation of youth in the committees. "Our young representatives must get maximum opportunity to put their views and participation in policy-making", he emphasized.

In conclusion, Prime Minister recalled the concept of One Nation-One Legislative Platform put forward in his 2021 address to the Presiding Officers and expressed happiness that Parliament and State Assemblies are working on this goal through E-Vidhan and Digital Sansad Platforms.


