Hon'ble Prime Minister Mr. Narendra Modi dedicates new Parliament House to the Nation

The Prime Minister said that this is not merely a building but is a reflection of the aspirations and dreams of 140 crore Indians. "This is a temple of our democracy that gives a message of India's resolution to the world", he said. He continued, "This new Parliament building connects planning to reality, policy to realization, willpower to execution, and sankalp to siddhi". This will be a medium for realizing the dreams of the freedom fighters. It will witness the sunrise of Aatmanirbhar Bharat and will see the realization of a Viksit Bharat. The Prime Minister said that this new building is an example of the coexistence of ancient and modern.

"New models can be established only by treading new paths", the Prime Minister remarked as he highlighted that the new India is realizing new goals and paving new ways. "There is a new energy, new zeal, new enthusiasm, new thinking and a new journey. There are new visions, new directions, new resolutions and a new trust", Prime Minister exclaimed. The Prime Minister said that the world is looking towards India's determination, its citizens' vigour and the life of human power in India with respect and hope. "When India moves forward, the world moves forward", he remarked. The Prime Minister underlined that the new Parliament House will invoke the development of the world from the development of India.

"India is not only a democratic nation but also the mother of democracy", the Prime Minister said as he noted that the nation is the principal foundation for global democracy. He underlined that democracy is not just a system that is practiced in India but it is a culture, thought and tradition. Referring to the Vedas, the Prime Minister highlighted that it teaches us the principles of democratic assemblies and committees. He also mentioned the Mahabharata where one can find the description of a Republic and said that India has lived and breathed democracy in Vaishali. "The Anubhav Mantappa of Lord Basweswara is a thing of pride for all of us", Prime Minister added.



The Prime Minister recalled the golden period of India's prosperity and architecture. He said that centuries of slavery robbed us of this glory. The Prime Minister said that India of the 21st century is filled with confidence. "Today's India is leaving behind the mentality of slavery and embracing that ancient glory of art. This new Parliament Building is a living example of this endeavour", the Prime Minister said. "This building has Virasat (heritage) as well as Vastu (Architecture), Kala (art) as well as kaushal (skill), sanskriti (culture) as well as notes of Samvidhan (Constitution). He pointed out that the interiors of Lok Sabha are themed on the national bird peacock and Rajya Sabha on the national flower lotus. The Parliament premises have the national tree Banyan. The new building incorporates the specialities of different parts of the country. He mentioned granite from Rajasthan, timber from Maharashtra and carpet by Bhadhoi artisans. "We witness the spirit of Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat in every particle of this building", he said.

The Prime Minister said that the new Parliament will give new energy and strength to the largest democracy of the world. He said while our Shramjivis have made the Parliament so grand, it is the responsibility of the Parliamentarians to make it divine with their dedication. Stressing the importance of the Parliament, the Prime Minister said that it is the resolution of 140 crore Indians that consecrates the Parliament. He expressed the hope that every decision taken here will adorn the coming centuries and strengthen the coming generations. The Prime Minister underlined that the path of empowerment of the poor, dalit, backward, tribal, disabled, and every deprived family of the society, along with prioritizing the development of the deprived will pass through this Parliament. "Every brick, every wall, every particle of this new Parliament House will be dedicated to the welfare of the poor", Prime Minister said. In the next 25 years, the Prime Minister emphasized that the new laws to be made in this new Parliament House will make India a developed nation, help in pushing poverty out of India and create new opportunities for the youth and women of the country. The Prime Minister said that the new Parliament Building will strengthen the nation's belief in its success and will inspire everyone towards a Viksit Bharat. "We will have to move with a spirit of - Nation First. We will have to keep the path of duty above all. We will have to be an example with our conduct while constantly improving ourselves. We will have to tread our own path", he said.

Concluding the address, the Prime Minister expressed confidence that the new building of the Parliament will become the basis for the creation of a new, prosperous, strong and developed India. "This is an India that walks the path of policy, justice, truth, dignity and duty and becomes stronger", the Prime Minister concluded.

SCO Summit under India's Chairmanship

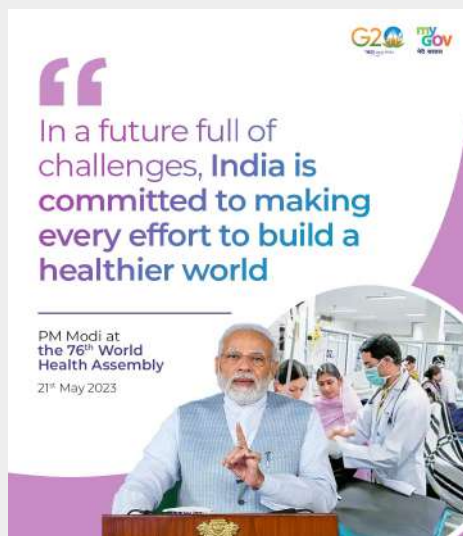


India assumed the rotating Chairmanship of SCO at the Samarkand Summit on 16 September 2022. Under India's first-ever Chairmanship, the 23rd Summit of the SCO Council of Heads of State will be held in the virtual format on 4 July 2023, chaired by Hon'ble Prime Minister Mr. Narendra Modi. All the SCO Member States, viz. China, Russia, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Pakistan, Tajikistan and Uzbekistan, have been invited to attend the Summit. In addition, Iran, Belarus and Mongolia have been invited as Observer States. As per SCO tradition, Turkmenistan has also been invited as the guest of the Chair. Heads of the two SCO Bodies – the Secretariat and the SCO RATS - will also be present. Further, Heads of six international and regional organizations have also been invited, viz. UN, ASEAN, CIS, CSTO, EAEU and CICA. The theme of the Summit is 'Towards a SECURE SCO'. The SECURE acronym was coined by the Prime Minister at the 2018 SCO Summit and stands for Security; Economy and Trade; Connectivity; Unity; Respect

for Sovereignty and Territorial Integrity; and Environment. These themes have been highlighted during our Chairmanship of SCO. India's Chairmanship of SCO has been a period of intense activity and mutually beneficial cooperation between Member States. India has hosted a total of 134 meetings and events, including 14 Ministerial-level meetings. India remains committed to play a positive and constructive role in the organization, and looks forward to a successful SCO Summit as the culmination of its Chairmanship.

Hon'ble Prime Minister Mr. Narendra Modi addresses 76th Session of the World Health Assembly



Hon'ble Prime Minister Mr. Narendra Modi addressed the 76th Session of the World Health Assembly in Geneva, Switzerland on 21st May 2023. Stressing for greater collaboration in healthcare, the Prime Minister highlighted the gaps in the global health architecture which were exposed during the COVID-19 pandemic and emphasized the need for a collective effort in building resilient global systems and boosting global health equity. Prime Minister highlighted India's commitment to international cooperation and informed that the country shipped almost 300 million doses of COVID-19 vaccines to over 100 countries including many countries from the Global South. The Prime Minister expressed confidence that supporting equal access to resources will be a top priority for the WHO in the coming years.

Highlighting India's achievements in the last few years regarding the availability, accessibility & affordability of healthcare, the Prime Minister gave examples of the world's largest health insurance scheme - Ayushman Bharat, the massive ramping up of health infrastructure, and the drive to provide sanitation and drinking water to millions of families in the country. Underlining that many of India's efforts are aimed at boosting health at the last mile in the country, the Prime Minister suggested that an approach which works with the scale of India's diversity can also become a framework for other nations. Prime Minister expressed keenness in supporting the WHO for similar efforts in low and middle-income countries. Concluding the address, the Prime Minister commended the WHO on 75 years of efforts in advancing Health for All. He remarked that the role of global institutions like the WHO will be even more important for the challenges that lie ahead in the future. "India is committed to helping every effort to build a healthier world", the Prime Minister concluded.

Hon'ble Prime Minister Mr. Narendra Modi inaugurates International Museum Expo 2023

Hon'ble Prime Minister Mr. Narendra Modi inaugurated the International Museum Expo 2023 at Pragati Maidan in New Delhi on 18th May 2023. The International Museum Expo is being organized as part of Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav to celebrate the 47th International Museum Day with the theme of the year 'Museums, Sustainability and Well Being'.

The Prime Minister mentioned the collective challenges of smuggling and appropriation of artefacts and said that countries with ancient cultures like India have been struggling with this for hundreds of years. He pointed out that many artefacts have been taken out of the country in an unethical manner before and after independence and urged everyone to work together to put an end to such crimes. He also expressed delight that various countries have started returning India's heritage amidst the increasing reputation of India in the world. He gave examples of the statue of Maa Annapurna stolen from Banaras, the statue of Mahishasurmardini stolen from Gujarat, the idols of Nataraja built during the Chola Empire, and the sword decorated with the name of Guru Hargobind Singh Ji. The Prime Minister informed that around 240 ancient artefacts have been recovered and brought back to India in the last 9 years in contrast to less than 20 for several decades after independence. He also stated that the smuggling of cultural artefacts from India has also reduced considerably in these 9 years. Prime Minister urged art connoisseurs around the world, especially those associated with museums, to further increase cooperation in this field. "There should not be any such artwork in any museum of any country, which has reached there in an unethical way. We should make this a moral commitment for all the museums", the Prime Minister said. The Prime Minister concluded by saying "We will conserve our heritage and will also create a new legacy"

Hon'ble Prime Minister Mr. Narendra Modi inaugurates programme marking National Technology Day 2023

Hon'ble Prime Minister Mr Narendra Modi inaugurated the programme marking National Technology Day 2023, at Pragati Maidan in New Delhi on 11th May 2023.

Addressing the gathering, the Prime Minister said that the 11th of May is one of the most prestigious days in the history of India. He underlined that today marks the day when India's scientists achieved the stupendous feat in Pokhran which made the entire nation proud. "I can never forget the day when Atal Ji made the announcement of India's successful Nuclear Testing", the Prime Minister remarked. He stated that the Pokhran Nuclear Testing not only helped India prove its scientific capabilities but also gave a boost to the global stature of the nation. "In Atal Ji's words", the Prime Minister said, "We have never stopped on our journey and never surrendered to any challenge that has come our way." The Prime Minister conveyed his greetings to every citizen on the occasion of National Technology Day.

"The India of today is moving forward in every direction that is necessary to become a tech leader", Prime Minister said. He noted that the number of tech incubation centers in the country has grown from roughly 150 in 2014 to more than 650 today. The Prime Minister also mentioned that India's Global Innovation Index Rank has gone from 81 to the 40th position where the youth of the country are setting up their own digital ventures and startups. Drawing comparisons with 2014, the Prime Minister mentioned that the number of startups in the country has increased from roughly 100 to 1 lakh recognized startups today and it has turned India into the third largest startup ecosystem in the world. Noting India's capability and talent, the Prime Minister pointed out that the growth took place at a time when the world is dealing with economic uncertainty. Underlining that the present moment is extremely precious for policymakers, the scientific community, research labs spread across the country and the private sector, the Prime Minister reiterated that even though the School to Startup journey will be made by the students, it is the stakeholders who must guide and encourage them at all times. The Prime Minister extended his entire support for the cause.

Hon'ble Prime Minister Mr. Narendra Modi visited Japan, Papua New Guinea and Australia from 19-24 May 2023. Prime Minister attended G-7 Summit in Hiroshima held under the Japanese Presidency. Prime Minister then travelled to Port Moresby, Papua New Guinea and hosted the 3rd Summit of the Forum for India–Pacific Islands Cooperation (FIPIC III Summit) jointly with Prime Minister of Papua New Guinea on 22 May 2023. Launched in 2014, FIPIC involves India and 14 Pacific Island Countries (PICs), namely, Cook Islands, Federated States of Micronesia, Fiji, Kiribati, Nauru, Niue, Palau, Papua New Guinea, Republic of Marshall Islands, Samoa, Solomon Islands, Tonga, Tuvalu and Vanuatu. Thereafter, Prime Minister Mr. Narendra Modi visited Sydney, Australia, on 22-24 May 2023 to participate in the Quad Leaders' Summit. Prime Minister also addressed the Indian diaspora at a community event in Sydney on 23 May 2023.



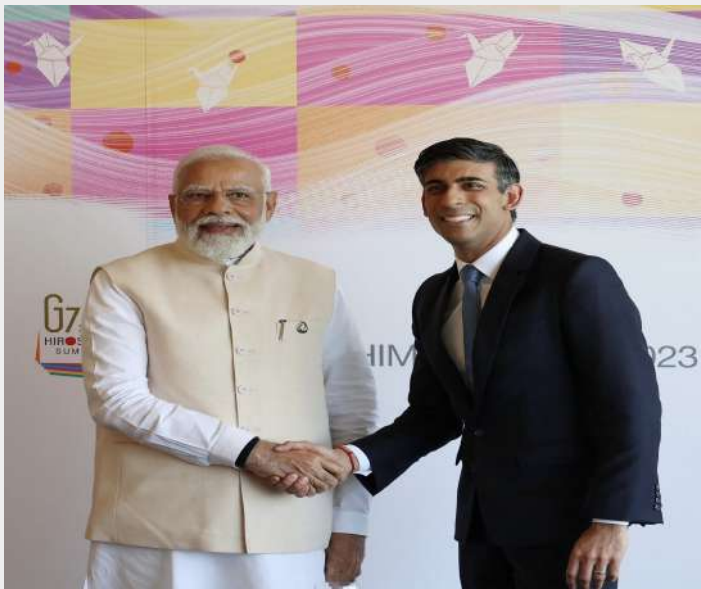

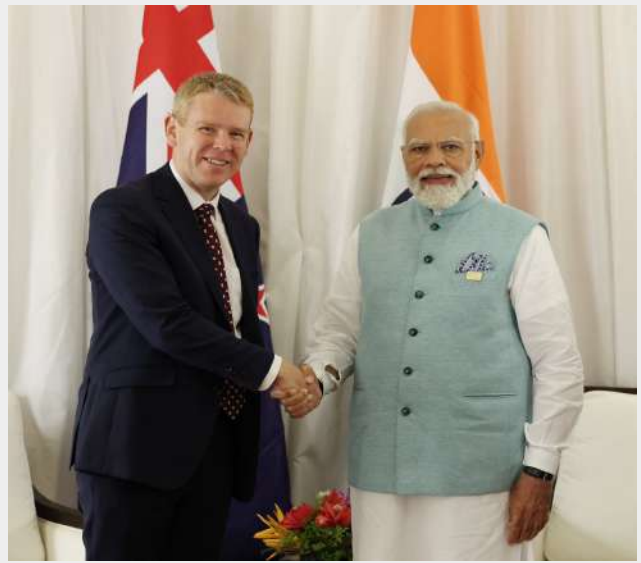

Hon'ble Prime Minister Mr. Narendra Modi participates in the Quad Leaders' Summit



Hon'ble Prime Minister Mr. Narendra Modi participated in the third in-person Quad Leaders' Summit in Hiroshima, Japan on 20 May 2023, along with Prime Minister Anthony Albanese of Australia, Prime Minister Fumio Kishida of Japan and President Joseph Biden of the United States of America.

The Leaders had a productive dialogue about developments in the Indo-Pacific which affirmed their shared democratic values and strategic interests. Guided by their vision for a free, open and inclusive Indo-Pacific, they reiterated the importance of upholding the principles of sovereignty, territorial integrity and peaceful resolution of disputes. In this context, they released the Quad Leaders' Vision Statement – Enduring Partners for the Indo-Pacific” which articulates their principled approach. To strengthen the resilience and prosperity of the Indo-Pacific the Leaders announced following initiatives which would complement the development priorities of the region:

A. Clean Energy Supply Chains Initiative which would facilitate research and development and support the Indo-Pacific's energy transition. In addition, the Quad Principles of Clean Energy Supply Chains were approved to guide engagement with the region on clean energy supply chain development. B. 'Quad Infrastructure Fellowships Programme' to support policy makers and practitioners in the region to design, build and manage sustainable and viable infrastructure in their countries. C. 'Partnership for Cable Connectivity and Resilience' to leverage Quad's collective expertise in design, manufacturing, laying and maintenance of undersea cables to secure and diversify these critical networks. D. Quad support for a small-scale ORAN deployment in Palau, the first in the Pacific region. They also released the ORAN Security Report to support industry investment in open, interoperable and secure telecom platforms. E. Quad Investors' Network has been launched as a private sector led platform to facilitate investments in strategic technologies. F. The Leaders welcomed progress of the Indo-Pacific Partnership for Maritime Domain Awareness, announced at their Summit last year in Tokyo. They noted that data sharing with partners in South East and the Pacific under this programme is underway and would soon include partners in the Indian Ocean Region. Prime Minister highlighted how India's approach to demand-driven development cooperation with the region was contributing to these efforts.

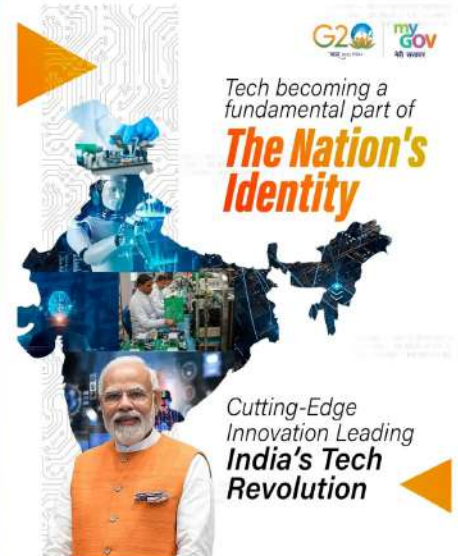

An inspiring effort related to the efficient use of water is also being undertaken in Khunti district of Jharkhand. People in Khunti have found a way out of the water crisis through check dams. Due to accumulation of water from the check dams, greens and vegetables have also started growing here. On account of this the income of the people is also increasing, and the needs of the region are also being fulfilled. Khunti has become a fascinating example of how any public participation effort brings with it many changes. I congratulate the people there for this endeavour.

3rd India- Zambia Foreign Office Consultations



The third Foreign Office Consultations (FOC) between India and Zambia were held in New Delhi on 25 May 2023. The Indian side was led by Shri Puneet R. Kundal, Joint Secretary (East & Southern Africa) and the Zambian side was led by Amb. Isabelle M.M. Lemba, Permanent Secretary (IRC) in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation of Zambia.

2. During the FOC, both delegations reviewed the multi-faceted bilateral relationship, covering political exchanges, development partnership projects, defence cooperation, trade and economic matters, consular issues, and cooperation in areas such as Agriculture, Education, Health, Mines & Minerals, SMEs, etc. The significance of high-level visits, particularly the early convening of the Joint Permanent Commission (JPC) was emphasized. While expressing satisfaction over the existing bilateral ties, both sides agreed to diversify cooperation in various areas, to further strengthen this relationship.

3. Both sides also discussed UN and other multilateral issues of mutual interest, including UN Security Council reforms, Common Market for Eastern and Southern Africa (COMESA), South African Development Cooperation (SADC) and African Continental Free Trade Area (AfCFTA).

4. Both sides agreed to continue high level political exchanges and regular meetings of the joint institutional mechanisms to keep the partnership vibrant and mutually beneficial.

5. Both sides agreed to hold the next round of Consultations at mutually convenient dates in 2024 in Lusaka.

High Commissioner H.E.
